Aims

To provide Complex Rehabilitation knowledge, training, equipment, and advice to the peoples of Fiji and the Pacific.

To work with agencies on the ground in the Pacific to identify those to whom the provision of Complex Rehab equipment, training and support would allow access to not only their immediate environment, but also their village, education and employment.

Work with the Spinal Injuries Association of Fiji and others to identify persons who are aspirational in themselves and with the aid of tailored packages become inspirational to their community.





Pressure Injury in the Pacific

Whilst we started with the idea of mobility, we were very soon confronted by the major issue of Pressure Injury mortality.

The stories and the empirical data that does exist suggest that a stage II—IV Pressure Injury is a two year death sentence unless there is intervention with, knowledge, training and assistive equipment.

Whilst we continue to work with Mobility, it is our work in education and provision of equipment that has the biggest impact.

In our first year we have provided over \$FJ500,000 in specialised mobility, seating and positioning product together with hands on training.


Pressure Injuries & Seating
